<p>Student leaders helped introduce SCAPP to attendees at the student engagement fair and encouraged registration for the newly implemented mentoring program.</p> <p>Executive board members wrote and distributed handwritten notes of encouragement that explained their “why APhA-ASP” statement and invited P1 and freshmen pre-pharmacy students to upcoming SCAPP week events.</p>	<p>Teams of two competed in a beanbag tournament and the winners were awarded the prize of pie-ing the professor with the most donations in their jar at the conclusion of the evening. These activities helped raise funds for our chapter to later perform patient care screenings and further the mission of the academy. This activity additionally facilitated connections among student pharmacists and faculty.</p>	<p>Each of the 18 SCAPP committees had co-chair representatives introduce themselves and describe their goals to attendees in one minute. The intent of this event was to help students, particularly new members, decide which committees to select for top preferences within their registration form. These student leaders also facilitated a “Minute-to-Win-It” game for participants to compete in and socialize with their peers.</p>	<p>Collaboration with other pharmacy organizations was crucial for this exciting event in which student pharmacists were able to actively learn about each of the national organizations within the SCAPP umbrella (NCPA, SCCP, SSHP, and PPA) and professional fraternity involvement, including Kappa Psi and Kappa Epsilon. The scavenger hunt led participants to key locations within the pharmacy building on campus and introduced students to resources or locations they may have been unfamiliar with before.</p>	<p>Current and prospective members gathered at our first meeting and participated in trivia about leadership, patient care projects, regional and national meetings, APhA-ASP, and networking. Participants also learned how to embrace the national theme, “Courage to Change” and chapter theme, “Fearlessly You.” The winner of the social media repost contest was also announced. This meeting yielded our record high attendance for the year thus far of 112 participants.</p>	<p>SCAPP Week culminated with our first major patient care event of the year where 35 members provided education about various health topics, ASCVD risk assessment, and nearly 500 free health screenings at the South Dakota State Fair. This was an exciting opportunity to advocate for the profession and showcase what pharmacists and student pharmacists can provide within the community and state.</p>
