JayDoc Free Clinic: Serving the Underserved in Specialty Settings The University of Kansas

Description

- JayDoc Free Clinic is a completely student-run primary care clinic providing quality care to the uninsured and underinsured populations of the Greater Kansas City area.

How is This Unique?

Run entirely by student volunteers in a collaborative environment

Students are supervised by licensed physicians and pharmacists

Students provide valuable services, such as patient education and medication reconciliations

All treatment is provided at no cost to our patients

Methods

- Partnership with medical student leaders in 2021 to add pharmacy services to specialty clinics they already put on, such as Diabetes Night.
- Interprofessional student leaders developed workflow processes to ensure patient-centered collaborative care.
- Collaboration with medical student leaders in 2022 to start new specialty clinics, including Cardio and Kidney Nights, to reach more patients



Monthly Timeline

Collaboration with medical students to determine specialty nights for the month

Schedule sign-ups sent out to pharmacy and medical students

Students attend their scheduled volunteer shifts and provide excellent patient care

Schedule created for both general and specialty nights for the month and sent to students

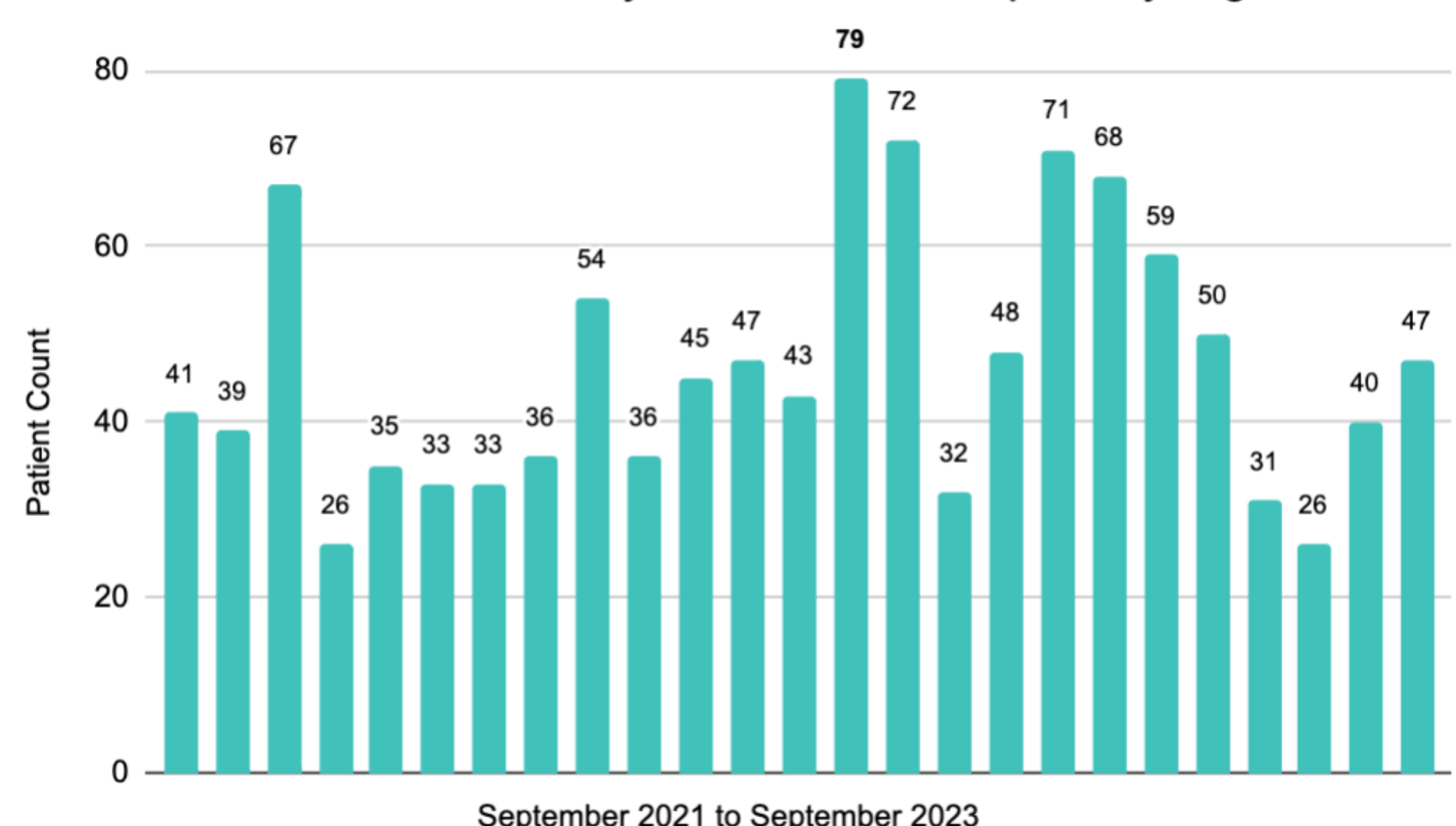
Impact

- Pharmacy-Led Education** has allowed students to put their clinical knowledge into practice by educating both patients and medical students.
- Interprofessional Development** with other volunteers at JayDoc Free Clinic gives students a chance to network and participate in a larger, patient-centered team.



- Over 100 student pharmacists have volunteered since specialty services were established in 2021, with 85% of students being APhA-ASP members.
- 300+ hours contributed by pharmacy students to clinic specialty nights, with 1,100+ patients receiving care they wouldn't otherwise receive.

Future Directions

- Engage pharmacy students and enhance patient education through a standardized medication education process.
- Provide specialty-specific interprofessional presentations to ensure the best care possible.
- The addition of pharmacy services at other specialty clinics, such as Gender Affirming Care and Dental Night, and working towards an even larger incorporation of students at the clinic.
