

- Launched in 2015
- 2020-2021 Stats
 - 93 chapter participated
 - 5,801 student pharmacists participated
 - 144 faculty and staff members participated
 - 113 pharmacists participated
 - 38,040 individuals educated through OTC Medicine Safety
 - 9,008 5th through 8th graders
 - 6,183 parents and caregivers
 - 5,769 coaches and educators
 - 6,614,781 individuals reached through public relations initiatives





- Get feedback from members on what they would like to see in relation to the project topic




