

### Introduction

Welcome to the Chapter Acheivement Report tracking tool. This excel sheet is designed to help you easily collect information about chapter participation and chapter events that will be integral to filling out your chapter acheivement report at the end of the year. We recommend filling this out throughout the year and having Patient Care Project Chairs complete the sections specific to their project.

### efinitions

The definitions sheet helps to outline and describe the specific information that we are looking for each section to ensure that you are collecting and entering the correct information when completing the Chapter Achievement Report. The following sheets are designed to help you easily collect information that correlates to each of these items. When applicable, we will indicate where this information appears within the workbook.

### Member Participation

To utilize this sheet, copy a roster of your members into the **Member List** (column A) of the sheet. The sheet is set to automatically add up the number of participants for each category in the **Total Participation** section (row 2) of the document. In this sheet, 0 means that the individual did not participate in the project/category event and 1 means that they did participate. You will notice that the sheet is set up to ONLY allow one of these two options. This is intentional, as when a change is made, the cell in row 2 that correlates to the topic will automatically update with the total. Chapter members should only be counted once for participating in a patient care project regardless of the number of events related to that patient care project they participate in.

### ledia Impressions

This worksheet does not require any editing and will autopopulate based on the information entered into the other project worksheets. This worksheet will help to fill out the media relations section at the beginning of the Chapter Achievement Report as well as the media realtions sections in the other sections of the report.

### Event/Activity Reporting

The headers of each worksheet directly corelate to the required information for that event type in the Chapter Achievement Report. After an event has completed, the event/activity lead should complete a row answering all of the requested items (row 3). Any items that request a value input will automatically be added to the total number at the top of the worksheet (row B).







Pharmacists' Role in Reproductive Health Post-Dobbs



APhA is seeking member feedback to help further inform policy on our role in reproductive health as they impact patients and pharmacists

Existing APhA policy covers many important topics; however, the policy does not explicitly contemplate the complexities and sensitivities that the *Dobbs* decision brings to light

To address this gap in our existing policy, APhA is holding listening sessions for members

APhA members may register for one or both of the sessions, where you can share practice experiences, concerns, and provide insight on how APhA policy should be directed. Feedback received by APhA during these listening sessions will provide critical background information for deliberation on these issues at the next seating of the APhA House of Delegates in March 2023.
